

MEETING FRIDAY 1-17-2025, 3.00 P.M.  
Municipal Bldg. 306 Byron Street McGrann

In attendance: Supervisors Palmer, Southworth and Hecker and Secretary Davis  
Citizens: Kathy Heilman, Armstrong Planning and A.J. Panian from the Leader Times

Meeting called to order by Chairman Palmer at 3:00P.M. followed by the pledge of allegiance.

Minutes of 1/6/2025 organizational and regular meetings were distributed, motion to approve by Southworth, seconded by Hecker, no public comment heard, unanimous.

Heilman ask the Board to recommend reallocation approximately \$41,000.00 of 2021 CDBG funds from Bishop Hill to Heilman Street and approximately \$44,000.00 of 2022 CDBG funds from Bishop Hill to Railroad Drive. She wants to put the bids out in February and open in March. Palmer made a recommendation to reallocate 2021 and 2022 CDBG monies from Bishop Hill to Heilman Street and Railroad Drive, seconded by Southworth, no public comment heard, unanimous. Heilman will attend another meeting when she receives the cooperative agreement.

Palmer made a motion to sign the CoStar Salt Contract for 140 tons of salt, seconded by Hecker, no public comment heard, unanimous.

Palmer stated the township has a feral cat problem, so both solicitors have worked on an ordinance. Palmer said there is an estimated 200 to 300 feral cats in the township and the problem is people are feeding and housing them so now the neighbors are complaining. The new ordinance would give the police teeth to hold people who are feeding or housing them responsible. This ordinance needs advertised so it can be passed at a meeting. Palmer said the issue is so bad property owners are trapping the cats and taking them to a farm which is illegal. The Township has had requests to put up more money, Palmer said that many cats would cost approximately \$45,000.00 to \$55,000.00 to have them fixed, Palmer said we are not using tax payers' money to do that. Palmer made a motion to advertise the cat ordinance, seconded by Southworth, Panian ask if the verbiage is set, Palmer told him yes, unanimous.

Palmer stated he has received several positive comments about Sgt. Rensel in how she has handled the cat issue.

Motion to pay the bills by Southworth and give the Secretary the right to pay all bills until the next meeting, seconded by Hecker, no public comment heard, unanimous.

Motion to adjourn by Southworth, seconded by Hecker, unanimous.
